Call For Tutorials

The IEEE BlackSeaCom series of conferences are held in the countries surrounding the Black Sea. The goal of the IEEE BlackSeaCom is to bring together visionaries in academia, research labs and industry from all over the world to the shores of the Black Sea to address many of the outstanding grand challenges that exist in the areas of communications and networking while having an opportunity to explore this exciting and dynamic region that has a rich history. The second edition of the conference will take place on May 27-30, 2014 in Odessa, Ukraine - a beautiful major port city on the Eurasian Crossroad.

The IEEE BlackSeaCom 2014 conference invites tutorial proposals on new and emerging topics within the communications and networking. The topics of interests are within the coverage of the conference, including but are not limited to:

- LTE/LTE-Advanced and Beyond 4G
- Internet of Things
- Nano-scale networks
- Molecular Communications
- Small Cells, Integration of Heterogeneous Networks (HetNets).
- Massive MIMO, Millimeter wave and Terahertz communications
- New infrastructures, platforms, test beds, and software
- Wireless networks, Ad hoc and mesh networks, Wireless sensor networks
- Cognitive radio networks
- Software Defined Networks, Cognitive Networks
- Cloud Computing, Network functions Virtualization
- Communication in challenging environments (underwater, underground, tunnels/mines, space, disasters)
- Information theory in wireless networks.

The planned tutorial sessions will be half day in length and take place on Tuesday May 27, 2014. The tutorial proposals should concisely describe the content and objectives of the tutorial. In particular, the proposals should include,

- Title
- Name, affiliation and short biography of Speaker(s)
- Abstract
- Objectives and motivation
- Timeliness and intended audience
- Prior history of the tutorial presentation and number of past attendees
- Detailed outline of the tutorial

Tutorial proposals should be submitted as a single pdf file, no more than four pages. The submissions should be made via email to tutorial chairs, Berk Canberk (canberk@itu.edu.tr) and Liljana Gavrilovska (liljana@feit.ukim.edu.mk) by January 31, 2014.
